Free, Public K-12 School

Westlake Charter School (WCS) is a K-12 public school created by parents and educators in Natomas. We opened our doors in 2005, and continue to be one of the top performing schools in Sacramento County.



Full Inclusion

WCS is celebrated for our special education full inclusion learning model. We believe full inclusion provides benefits for all students by providing a diverse and accepting learning environment where all students have a sense of belonging.



After School Programs

WCS offers several After School Programs. Our BASE program is open from 7AM to 6PM daily for families needing before and after school care. We also offer free parent-led clubs, paid enrichment opportunities (including dance, music, and STEAM) as well as a 6th-8th grade athletics program.





Learning Environment

WCS has small class sizes, with 22 students in K-3rd grade and 28 in 4th-8th grade classrooms that use flexible seating to address different diverse styles. Every student learns Art, Spanish & PE from credentialed specialty teachers.



1:1 Classroom Technology

Our students, 2nd through 8th grade, have 1:1 access to educational technology. Our Kindergarten and 1st grade students use technology in workshop and small-group settings. We use technology to personalize learning for each of our students.



Family Involvement

Our WAVE (Westlake Association of Volunteer Explorers) volunteers build community through service to our students, educators, and families. WAVE asks each family to volunteer 30 hours as partners in their student's education.




